Complete the <u>St. Petersburg College Admission Application</u> and pay the non-refundable fee. *Note to Returning Students If you have not enrolled in courses in the six previous semesters, you will need to complete the online <u>Readmission Application in MySPC</u>. You will be asked if you want to complete the readmission process when you log in to MySPC. Failure to do so will prohibit or delay your course enrollment.

Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school transcript(s) or GED transcripts. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement, but must submit an official transcript documenting completion of degree.

Submit Florida State certified Emergency Medical Technician Certificate number and issue date or be enrolled in a program that will lead to certification by the end of Phase I.

Selection Criteria

When the number of eligible applicants exceeds the program availability, selection will be based on priority given to SPC EMS students, Pinellas County Fire/EMS agencies, institutions, or organizations. A maximum of 40 students will be accepted into the program.

> All application requirements must be satisfied by the close of the application window.

If you are not offered admission, you will need to reapply during the next appropriate application acceptance period.

If you are offered admission you will need to complete the following pre-enrollment requirements by a specific due date to maintain eligible status.

- Complete the Letter of Intent survey (Provided in admission E-Mail)
- Attend a mandatory PSAV Paramedic Program orientation: May 5, 2020 from 5:30 p.m. 8:30 p.m. or May 6, 2020 from 1:30 p.m. 4:30 p.m.
- Successfully pass a background check and drug screening. (Instructions provided in admission E-mail)
- Complete the Health Examination Form and any required immunizations and titers. (Instructions provided in admission E-mail)
- Completion of Healthcare Provider CPR Certification/American Heart Association Certification required (Details provided in admission E-mail)

Program Information

The PSAV Paramedic program comprises of a minimum of 1103 contact hours which will prepare the student for the Paramedic Certification Exam. Classroom sessions meet two days per week for 8 hours each day and follows a shift friendly schedule. The 45 weeks is divided into three phases, each phase totaling 15 weeks in length. Along with the classroom, students will complete a required number of hours and competencies in the clinical and field environment.

Classes begin in July 2020 at the Allstate Center

Theory: Mondays or Tuesday 9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

Labs: Wednesday or Thursday 9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

Clinicals: Scheduled during the end of Phase I and completed by Phase III.

Field internship: Scheduled during the end of Phase II and completed by the end of Phase III.
