<b>New</b> students must complete the St. Petersburg College Admission Application and pay the non-refundable fee. <b>Returning</b> students must complete the online Readmission steps in MySPC if you have not enrolled in the previous six semesters. <u>Admissions and Readmissions</u>
Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school transcript(s) or GED transcripts. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement. <b>Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration.</b> <u>Submitting Official Transcripts</u>
Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited colleges and/or universities. Submit official transcripts showing completion of an Associate degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution. Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration. Submitting Official Transcripts
Students must demonstrate they are at college level in Writing and Reading either through appropriate test scores or through appropriate course completion.
Students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale in all postsecondary coursework. Your Academic Standing can have an impact on your admission, enrollment, and financial aid eligibility. See the SPC Academic Standing Policy for details. <u>Academic Standing Policy</u>
Read and acknowledge the <u>Funeral Services Technical Standards</u> ( <u>Essential Functions</u> ).
Complete the following Support/Pre-Entry Courses with a minimum 2.5 GPA:

Please note that any combination of three unsuccessful attempts in FSE prefix courses will result in an ineligible application for admission or readmission to the program.

# **Selection Criteria**

Due to enrollment limitations, meeting minimum requirements does not guarantee admission. When the number of eligible applications exceeds program availability, selective criteria is used to determine which applicants are offered admission. This criterion is based on a point system using health program GPA and completion of pre-entry and support coursework, according to the following:

- 40 points may be awarded based on the GPA from the following courses: FSE 1000, FSE 2061, ACG 2021 and BUL 2241. (Minimum 2.5 GPA required for consideration)
- A grade of P will be assigned the value of a student's cumulative GPA for selective admission GPA calculation purposes for this program, excluding the computer competency.
- > All application requirements must be satisfied by the close of the application window.
