- Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school or GED transcripts indicating completion of standard high school diploma or equivalency. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement.

- Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) and/or universities currently or previously attended. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened.

- □ Students must demonstrate they are at college level in Writing, Reading, and Math either through appropriate test scores or through appropriate course completion.

- □ Students must have a minimum grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.00 scale in all Physical Therapist Assistant program general education and support courses completed at the time of application. Complete a minimum of 24 hours of observation, volunteer service or paid work experience in a physical therapy department verified by a Physical Therapist or a Physical Therapist Assistant. This requirement must include at least two different clinical settings. Some hours must be completed in inpatient (hospital/skilled nursing facility, inpatient rehab facility) and some hours must be completed in **outpatient** (sports medicine, private practice). This requirement must be completed within two years preceding the application deadline. The **Physical Therapist Assistant Observation/Experience Record** (Page 6 of this Admissions Checklist) should be printed, completed, and uploaded into the Health Program Application at the time of application. **2025 Applicants unable to complete observation hours prior to the application deadline of May 15th will be permitted to complete and submit their Observation/Experience Record on or before July 25, 2025. If observation hours are in progress at the time of application, write "in progress" on the Observation/Experience Record and upload into the Health Program Application. When observation hours are completed, email a completed Observation/Experience Record to HealthAdvising@spcollege.edu on or before July 25, 2025. Physical Therapist Assistant degree will prepare students for the PTA National Physical Therapy Licensing Exam through the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy. One cohort is available each year: Fall Completion of the program allows a student to apply to SPC's B.A.S. Health Services Administration. Clinical facilities may prohibit students who do not have an assigned social security number from participating in clinical experiences which are a mandatory component of the curriculum. If other placement options are not available, the student would need to withdraw from that semester and would not be able to progress in the program.
- These factors must be taken into consideration prior to pursuing admission to the program.

 PTA classes are typically held 3-4 days per week. The schedule below is subject to change.

Second Year Students

The schedule fluctuates due to clinical affiliations. Please contact the Program Director with questions. In addition, three times during the two-year program, students will go offsite for a clinical affiliation:

- 1) 5½ weeks summer term after student's first year
- 2) 5 weeks in January of second year
- 3) 51/2 weeks in mid-March of second year

Each clinical requires a minimum of 40 hours/week and may include weekend and/or early morning or evening hours. Admitted students will need to make financial, work schedule and arrangements to accommodate these time periods.

Selection Criteria, Selection Process and Admissions

- All application requirements must be satisfied by the closing of the application window, except courses being taken at SPC during the summer term *including pre-entry, support, and general education courses*.
- 34 students admitted. Typically, 125-150 students apply.
- The average GPA for acceptance varies for each applicant pool, but typically falls between 3.7 and 3.8.
- When the number of eligible applicants exceeds program availability, selective criteria are used to determine which applicants are admitted.
 - This criterion is based on a point system using the pre-entry GPA and completion of pre-entry, general education, and support coursework as well as the interview score. In the case of a tie, a lottery will be used.
- Students will be considered using a point system based on health program GPA, and the number of general education and support coursework credits completed.
- **29 points** may be awarded based on the number of health program pre-entry, general education and support coursework credits completed. (DEP 2004 is not included in the selection criteria calculation.)
- 4**0 points** may be awarded based on the health program GPA earned from pre-entry coursework, excluding Computer/Information Literacy.
- **30 points** may be awarded based on participation in an academic group interview. The interview includes a group discussion and individual essay.
- Current enrollment in summer courses at St Petersburg College only will be included in the calculation.
- Selection Process
- **May 16** (or first business day after the window closes) All applicants will receive an Admissions Timeline email summarizing the process
- **June 1** (or first business day after) All applicants will receive one of the following three emails:
 - 1) Email to **Incomplete** applicants (missing transcripts, coursework, or other application requirements)
 - 2) Email notifying applicants whose **PTA Admissions GPA is below 3.5** indicating they will not be admitted to the program to allow time for student to make other plans.
 - Historically, no one has been admitted to the PTA program with an admissions GPA below 3.5.
 - 3) Email for applicants with a **PTA Admissions GPA of 3.5 or higher** indicating they will be offered the opportunity to participate in the interview segment of the application process.
- Mid-June PTA Interviews held for applicants who received an invitation (email #3).
- Late June All interviewees will receive an email. The email will be one of the following:
 - 1) Email for candidates with an Interview score below 24 to allow time for student to make other plans. Historically, no one has been admitted to the PTA program with an Interview score below 24.
 - 2) Email for candidates with an Interview score of 24 or above indicating they will continue in the application process with final notification after the summer term ends.
- Late July SPC Summer Term ends
- Late July Acceptance and Denial emails sent to all applicants who are still in the running.
- **End of July** Mandatory Program Orientation

If you are admitted, you will need to complete the following pre-enrollment requirements to maintain eligible status.

- Complete the Notice of Intent survey by the date indicated in the admission email.
- Successfully pass a background check and drug screening by the date indicated in the admission email.
- Complete the Health Education Program orientation on the date indicated in the admission email.
- Complete any required immunizations.

If you are not admitted, please discuss admissions requirements with an Academic Advisor and consider reapplying during a future application cycle.
