Application materials should be submitted in time to be posted for immediate review when SPC offices reopen.

- New** students must complete the St. Petersburg College Admission Application and pay the non-refundable fee. **Returning** students must complete the online Readmission steps in MySPC if you have not enrolled in the previous six semesters. [Admissions and Readmissions](#)
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) high school or GED transcripts indicating completion of standard high school diploma or equivalency. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. Applicants who have earned an Associate in Arts, Associate in Science, Associate in Applied Science, Baccalaureate, or higher degree from a regionally accredited institution are waived from this requirement. **Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration.** [Submitting Official Transcripts](#)
- Submit official, unopened (sealed) transcripts from all regionally accredited college(s) and/or universities currently or previously attended. We do not accept unofficial copies or official copies that have been opened. **Transcripts must be received and evaluated by St. Petersburg College prior to the application deadline to ensure consideration.** [Submitting Official Transcripts](#)
- Students must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.00 on a 4.00 scale in all postsecondary coursework. Your Academic Standing may have an impact on your admission, enrollment, and financial aid eligibility. See the SPC Academic Standing Policy for details. [Academic Standing Policy](#)
- Submit official transcripts showing an A.S. or A.A.S. degree in Veterinary Technology from an AVMA accredited program showing 60 credits earned.
- Complete a minimum of 15 semester hours of transferable general education coursework from a regionally accredited college or university which demonstrates college level in Writing, Reading, and Math. *To view approved General Education courses, please refer to [General Education Requirements](#)*

Selection Criteria and Admissions

- **All application requirements must be satisfied by the closing of the application window.**
- The Veterinary Technology Online B.A.S. degree program will accept applications continually throughout the year. Please apply once your prerequisite coursework has been completed and posted to your SPC transcript. All qualified students will be admitted and will be eligible to enroll in the following semester.

Transfer Coursework

It is the student's responsibility to ensure transfer coursework meets SPC course requirements. Transfer courses for which there is no direct SPC equivalent will be posted as elective credit and designated with a '999' course number. If you believe a course posted as an elective should satisfy a degree requirement, you may submit a request for **Alternate Satisfaction**.

Before you begin completing the survey, be sure to have the following available:

- Course name and course number of the course taken at the former institution
- Official or unofficial copy of the transcript from the former institution to upload
- Syllabus of the course you completed and wish to use to satisfy an SPC course

Graduation Requirements

In addition to satisfying the General Education course requirements, students must:

- Complete all core courses required for their program
- earn a cumulative 2.0 GPA in all courses completed
- earn a cumulative 2.0 GPA in all courses completed at SPC

- **FOREIGN LANGUAGE**

If students have not completed two consecutive years of the same foreign language in high school or 8 credits in college, students will need to complete 8 credits of foreign language before completing the B.A.S. program.

- **CIVIC LITERACY**

Students entering an A.S. Degree program in the 2022-2023 academic school year and thereafter must demonstrate competency through successful completion of a Civic Literacy course

AND by achieving a 60% passing score on the Florida Civic Literacy Examination (FCLE)
