<p>Status of the CON Overall Enrollment Budget Impact Student Success Health & Vet Tech Community Showcase</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overall Enrollment: between programs is 1158 – slight increase when compared to last year 1150 – which was a decline. The ADN program had an Increase of 22 additional students in level 1 – A big thank you to BayCare EAYL program (which allowed us to fill their program with students) & Palms of Pasadena • LPN enrollment continues to decline: we have removed the year of experience requirement – the community was not happy with this change so we are looking for ways to increase collaboration to help the students in LPN programs within the community to prepare before they come to SPC. One factor noted is that many of them cannot meet the science GPA 2.75 • Budget Impact: - see attached Power Point Slide • Student Success: continues to be in the high 80's – 90's due to faculty efforts. Qualitative comments from academic year 17-18 were reviewed, levels are working on action plans & strategies for implementation. 	Leslie Sabo – BPVA – Open to exploring the options. Possibly two clinical week end days every other week end? Also open to 10 or 12 hour shifts and suggest piloting 12 hour rotations. BayCare is also in agreement. SPC will be piloting 12 hour shifts in OB and pediatric rotations in Spring 2019 with plans to transition to 12 hour shifts in Level 4 after our re-accreditation.	
Status of RN to BSN Course changes FACN – USF St. Pete	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enrollment: current students: 559 (last fall 616). • We continue to experience decreased enrollment. We have made a few changes to combat this: national certifications are now counted as an elective – this is an incentive for those who complete the certification as a requirement at your organization – effective summer 18 (this slightly increased our enrollment). • We are admitting 3 x year with limited enrollment during the summer. • We implemented rolling admissions and have removed application dates. • Based on current, the direction of the BSN nurse, new courses include Special Topics in Health Care which will replace Family and Global Health Care Issues and revisions to Multicultural for global focus starting Spring 19. • Reviewing policies that are a barrier to student success and progression. For example, our student progression policy after 3 failures, they are dismissed from the program and have to sit out for a year. Upon returning they have 4 criterions they have to meet. Also discussed was patient education and communication, changes in SPC Pharmacology course and nurse to nurse handoff of students.</p> <p>Leslie Sabo – Bay Pines VA participating in semi-annual nursing development and piloting telehealth clinical rotations. Looking at ways to use the AACN vision to shift from acute care to longer term care. The Nurse Residency (Transition to Practice) program is a very robust 12 month long program. Importance of teaching student nurses to find their resources.</p> <p>Brianna Delarosa – Suncoast Hospice can only accommodate 8 hour in patient clinical rotations. Very excited about communication objectives.</p> <p>Marjory Buchner – SPC BSN Student - Likes the changes made to the global health class. The Community Health Theory course has a high load of projects and little time to do it. Possibly 10 weeks for theory portion rather than the current 8 weeks? 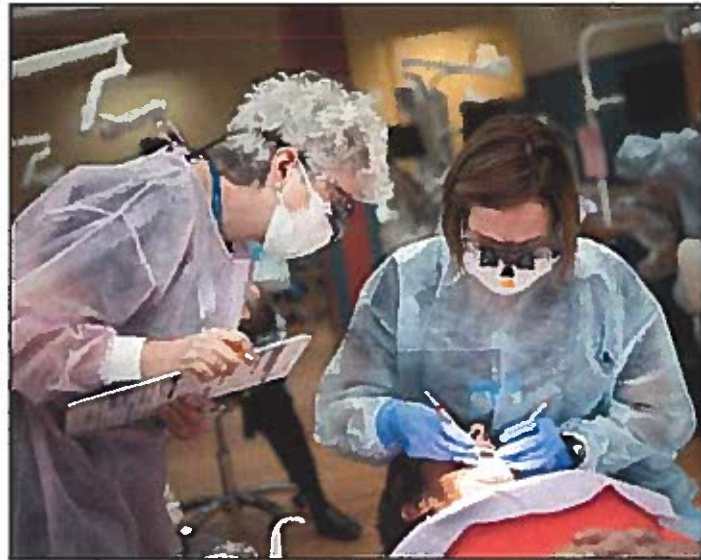
