(New Business continued)	<p><b><u>Discussion regarding Students with Criminal Backgrounds:</u></b></p> <p>There was a discussion regarding what to tell students with criminal backgrounds as to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Waivers</li> <li>• Expungements</li> <li>• Sealing records</li> </ul> <p>Debra mentioned <a href="#">HB 1125</a> “Eligibility for Employment as Child Care Personnel” that was approved by the Governor on 3/24/2016. The criteria is becoming more strict.</p> <p><i>Provides criteria for disqualification from employment for child care personnel; requires that certain persons who have been granted an exemption from disqualification from child care employment be rescreened by specified date; provides applicability with respect to specified provisions adopted during same legislative session.</i></p> <p>With DCF, a job offer is a requirement for an individual to apply for a <a href="#">Request for Exemption from Disqualification</a>.</p> <p>The goal would be for students to be able to apply for an exemption from DCF to accelerate the process <b>before</b> their job search</p> <p>There is a clearinghouse of information (reciprocity) with DOC, DCF, DJJ, ADP, AHCA.</p> <p><b><u>Curriculum Changes</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Beginning Fall 2016, there will be major program and certificate revisions to comply with the state requirements to reduce the total number of credits to 60 for the A.S. degree and 18 for the certificates (24 for the Addiction Studies CT).</li> <li>➤ The AS degree will reduce to 60 credit hours (from 65-73) for the 2016-2017 year.</li> </ul>	<p>Debra P. stated that Tennessee has a “Certificate of Employability”  <a href="http://www.jdsupra.com/legalnews/what-is-a-tennessee-certificate-of-75621/">http://www.jdsupra.com/legalnews/what-is-a-tennessee-certificate-of-75621/</a></p> <p>Cheryl will look into getting support to advise Human Services students before they seek employment and the how-tos on sealing/expunging records and the pros and cons of the process/costs.</p> <p>This individual or “Navigator” could help student with the appeal process through DCF and DOC to gather documents, put their packet together and prepare how to go through each step.</p> <p>Solutions Behavioral Healthcare could possibly be a site where students could go to get this type of support and navigation through the exemption process.</p> <p>Cheryl will also invite a representative from DCF &amp; FCB to the next Advisory Committee Meeting to help explain some of the questions brought up. FCB – Amy Farrington and / or April May of DCF.</p> <p>It was discussed about changing the terminology concerning the “tracks” or “sub plans” in the AS degree to the term “minor” or “concentration”. Cheryl will check with the curriculum office regarding this option.</p>

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<p>(New Business continued)</p>	<p>➤ The two HUS certificates and one ATD will become CCCs (College Credit Certificates) and the credit hours will be reduced as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Addiction Studies Certificate - 24 credits (from 39)</li> <li>- Youth Development Professional Certificate – 18 credit (from 30)</li> <li>- Community Health Worker Certificate (formerly named the Maternal and Child Health ATD) – 18 credits (from 21)</li> <li>- The CHW-CT will begin in the fall of 2017. The MCHL-ATD will remain in place and accept students until the summer semester of 2017. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>-All certificates will be imbedded in the AS degree.</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b><u>SPC Titan Collegiate Exchange Club</u></b></p> <p>The former Human Services Organization is now called the SPC Titan Collegiate Exchange Club. The Burg Exchange Club (part of the Northeast Exchange Club) has asked SPC to be the first organization sponsored by them. They will help organize the SPC club. 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<p><u>Agency/Round Table Updates (continued)</u></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Briefly discussed the MCAP through the FCB</li> </ul> <p><b><i>Douglas Bonar – A Center for Wellness</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>They have received their recertification for two years.</li> <li>A new program Douglas has created called “<i>Roots &amp; Wings: the Way of Wholeness</i>” will address domestic violence from a new perspective working from the Noetic Sciences</li> </ul> <p><b><i>Debra Prewitt – JWB</i></b></p> <p>Explained several JWB Programs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Family Services Initiative</li> <li>Collective Impact Initiative</li> <li>Early Leaders/Future Leaders</li> <li>Hunger Initiative is a new program to make food available to children who are not in the after care programs. They can walk-in for breakfast or lunch at any facility that has the Break Spot program. They will be located in schools, Neighborhood Family Centers and YMCAs and there will mobile trucks available.</li> </ul> <p><b><i>Sean King – Solutions Behavioral Healthcare Consultants</i></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Focusing on criminal intervention. Trying to meet more specific needs (not just what the judges or probation officers recommend).
